Henny Hughes was purchased by Sheikh Rashid last summer after breaking his maiden at Monmouth Park and taking the Tremont S. at Belmont by 15 lengths. He made it three in a row in the GII Saratoga Special, then had to settle for second in the GI Hopeful S., GI Champagne S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The eye-catching chestnut was not at his best while wintering in Dubai, but came to hand when he returned to the U.S. this spring. Off at 2-5 in his comeback, the July 1 GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup S., he romped to a 10-length victory, stopping the timer in 1:08 1/5 for the six furlongs. Trainer Kieran McLaughlin brought the colt to the King's Bishop off eight weeks' rest, and was rewarded for his patient handling with a dominant victory. The winner goes next in the Oct. 7 GI Vosburgh S. "The Vosburgh is against older [horses], but he's ready for it," McLaughlin said.
